Dr. G. Rosai *no slide* Case 14 23 month female child with large abdominal mass with hepatomegaly and osteoporosis.
DIAGNOSIS: Hepatoblastoma.

Dr. L. Lu 14227/78 41 year old man's upper lip.
DIAGNOSIS: Trichofolliculoma.

no slide 29794/79 Bone biopsy from 55 year old man who had anaemis, thrombocytopenia and large nodes.
DIAGNOSIS: Mucin producing adenocarcinoma of lung occuring in a patient with chronic lymphatic leukaemia.

Cases circulated for meeting #74 were then discussed.

Dr. G. Rosai *no slide* Case 18 59 year old lady with bilateral ovarian tumours.
DIAGNOSIS: Borderline serous carcinoma with underlying endometrioid carcinoma.

Dr. D. Buntine *no slide* 80/1033 47 year old lady with bilateral masses in pelvis. Each ovary weighed in excess of 1000 gms.
DIAGNOSIS: Signet ring cell secondaries from a primary adenocarcinoma of cecum.

Dr. D. Owen 4744/80 Axillary node from male aged 53.
DIAGNOSIS: Sezery's syndrome. Typical cells found in peripheral blood after making histological diagnosis.

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Case W/365/73

This 49 year old man has progressive shortness of breath and chest pains.

DIAGNOSIS: Chemotherapeutic changes in lung. Patient on Myleran for 7 years for chronic granulocytic leukaemia.

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Case 78/397

67 Year old lady who experienced depression and hypertension, under psychiatric care, treated with usual dose of Uridon, Induril and Melleril. She was found hypotensive and slightly icteric with hematomesis.

DIAGNOSIS: Insecticide associated toxic hepatitis, most probably organophosphates.

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465/79

W.C. male aged 60 years. Admitted to intensive care with chills, "myalgia" and progressive dyspnea. Chest x-ray showed consolidation of most of the right lung and left lower lobe. Cardiac arrest 4½ hours after admission.

DIAGNOSIS: Legionaire's disease.

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1774/80

Open biopsy of one of many large radiopaque nodules present in both lower pulmonary lobes by chest x-ray in 74 year old female with dyspnea and weight loss of short duration. Subsequent investigations showed increased uptake of isotope in right femoral shaft by bone scan and tumour-like densities in both liver and pancreas by ultrasonography. Bilateral renal arteriograms revealed several avascular areas in both kidneys and routine x-ray of the right femoral shaft was negative.

DIAGNOSIS: The members present were divided between renal cell carcinoma and lymphoma. Further information on this case will be available.

Male 45 years. Contents of cyst of upper tibia.

DIAGNOSIS: Primary lipo and fibrosarcoma of right tibia probably representing sarcomatous transformation in an old non-ossifying fibroma. Reviewed by AFIP.

FOLLOW-UP: Amputation - alive and well after 10 years.

Dr. R. Banerjee 12 80/1622

Male 17 years of age. GI hemorrhage. Heterotopic/ectopic gastric mucosa lining Meckel's diverticulum with area of adjacent (peptic) ulceration.

Dr. H. Benediktsson 13 80/5917-3

27 year old multipara from Thompson. DIAGNOSIS: Schistosomiasis. Patient previously in East Africa.

Dr. D. Cavers 14 80B73-19

59 year old female who died of metastatic breast carcinoma. DIAGNOSIS: 2 sections on slide - (1) duodenal lymphangioma; (2) Involvement of esophagus by secondary breast carcinoma.

Dr. N.M. Pettigrew 15 80/6087

Biopsy abdomen female aged 42. DIAGNOSIS: Subcutaneous endometriosis, previous Caesarean section.

Dr. T. Cooney 16 77/21727-19

Male aged 47 years with a 5 cm. mass in right lower lobe near hilum. DIAGNOSIS: Ganglioneuroblastoma with maturation.

Dr. W.S. Hwang 17 S79-853 -2

Male 10 years. Acute abdominal pain and fever. Mesenteric nodule enlarged. DIAGNOSIS: Typhoid fever.
