- 526: 53 YOWM referred to hospital for LUQ mass and pulmonary nodules. The LUQ mass had increased markedly in size over the previous 2 weeks.
- 527: 67 YOWM referred to hospital for generalized lymphadenopathy with hepato- and splenomegaly and WBC of 12,800 with 52% lymphocytes. Bone marrow biopsy was unremarkable except for a small lymphoid follicle, with well differentiated cells. Quantitative immunoglobulins showed a marked increase in the IgG and IgA fractions. Direct Coombs test was positive.
- 528: 24 YOWM with a 1 year history of a painless swelling under the left lower eyelid.
- 529: 55 YOWM with a long history of alcohol abuse and hepatic cirrhosis died from liver failure. He had no signs or symptoms of other GI disease, although these lesions were found in the intestines at autopsy.
